Exemplary role sheets

You attach particular importance to peace and security, especially in times of war in Europe.	Diversity, inclusion and non-discrimination are particularly important to you. You want a colourful EU.	You are a strong, emancipated person and believe that gender equality should be further promoted.
You believe in pluralism. In the EU, there are diverse opinions and diverse political forces that compete with each other. This is important to protect our democracy! You think that mobility and freedom of movement within the EU are great.	You are passionate about social justice and are committed to equality of opportunity.	You are passionate about multiculturalism and see diversity as Europe's greatest strength.
You attach particular importance to sustainability. Humanity has polluted the planet enough, now it is important to preserve what still exists.	You believe that dialog and understanding are the key to everything. Compromise is a lot of work, but it is necessary for a common Europe.	In your opinion, human rights are the most important asset that needs to be protected. Without human rights, many other values are useless.
You think too many values can also make the onepot "meaningless". We need to concentrate on a few important values.	You believe that all values have their justification and are equally important. No European value should be tossed aside.	You think the EU needs to show transparency and become more understandable and approachable for citizens.
For you, there is a clear ranking of values. You see human rights and democracy at the top, mobility, for example, further down.	The rule of law is particularly important to you: laws must apply to everyone, everywhere and at all times. The EU must ensure this.
