

Exercise: EU Integration - a timeline in the form of a memory

Overview

- Grade: from 10th grade
- School form: general and vocational schools
- Duration: 90 min
- Method: memory
- Subject: European integration
- School subjects: Politics, History
- Operators: reproduce, explain, evaluate
- Group size: minimum of six people
- Social form: group work

Description

- The exercise "EU integration - a timeline in memory form" is a playful exploration of the history of European integration. With the help of a memory, the students get to know the most important events of European integration and then arrange them in a timeline.
- This way, the students reproduce the most important events of the European integration process and evaluate them in order to place them in chronological order.

Learning objectives

- Students learn about the most important events of European integration.
- Students are able to organize the various steps of European integration chronologically and reproduce them.

Materials:

1. The accompanying PowerPoint presentation
2. The Memory of European Integration

Preparation

1. The worksheets for the memory must be printed out and cut out so all groups receive a copy.
2. Calculate the number of groups: Ideally, a group should consist of four participants.

Procedure

1. The students are divided into groups of four. Each group is given a memory. Their task is now to find the matching pairs.
2. As soon as the students have found all the pairs, they should sort the pairs chronologically and create a timeline of European integration.

3. Discuss the timeline together in plenary and work out the correct order together.

Time table

1. Introduce and explain the exercise - 5 min.
2. Divide into groups and hand out the materials - 5 min.
3. Play memory - find the right pairs together as a group - 30 min.
4. Evaluate the pairs and create a timeline - 30 min.
5. Discuss the results in plenary - 20 min.
